









Advance Google Image Search for Copyright Friendly Images

Note: Many photographers are attaching copyright friendly licenses to their photos when they upload them. An increasingly popular license is offered through the [Creative Commons](https://creativecommons.org/). If you find a photo with a Creative Commons license, be sure to check the icons to ensure you understand what permissions are granted for use of the photo. The photo in the example below is licensed under a Creative Commons license.

<p>1. Go to Google Image search.</p>	
<p>2. Click on "Advanced Search"</p>	
<p>3. Scroll down to Usage Rights and select "labeled for reuse."</p>	
<p>4. Enter your search term in the search box. For example, "maple sugar hut".</p>	
<p>5. Click on the photo you like and then go to the website that hosts the photo by clicking on the website URL.</p>	
<p>6. Find the title of the photo, the name of the photographer, the date it was uploaded and the website that hosts the images. (The photo to right is hosted on the photo sharing website called Flickr.)</p>	 <p><i>Hint: you may find the photographer's full name in his/her profile.</i></p>
<p>7. Locate permission details. On Flickr, scroll down and you will find the Creative Commons licensing icons on the right under Additional Information. You may also find the date of the photo was taken.</p>	
<p>8. Create a credit line for your photo. If the photo is licensed under the Creative Commons, indicate this with a "CC" and indicate the permissions granted. If required, create a bibliographic citation as well and add it to your Works Cited list.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;">Maple Syrup Hut by SBC 9 CC/By/NC</p>
